From our latest questionnaire, we noticed that several parents responded 'don't know' to some of the questions. We thought, therefore, that it would be useful to give you more information about these areas!

MY CHILD RECEIVES APPROPRIATE HOMEWORK FOR THEIR AGE (10% Don't Know)

Homework is given out to children relating to their learning here in school. If you are unsure about homework, please call in to see the class teacher. Children are given age appropriate Reading, Maths (MyMaths) relating to their current learning and Spelling together with a choice of homework each half term which is often topic related. Each class also sends a newsletter out each half term to let parents know what their child is studying.

THE SCHOOL DEALS EFFECTIVELY WITH BULLYING (10% Don't Know)

I hope this is because you have never needed to know! However, bullying is dealt with very seriously and we work with parents to ensure actions are taken to prevent issues escalating. With our friendly, open approach, parents are very welcome to call in to discuss any issues they wish to with the class teacher or Miss Brady.

THE SCHOOL RESPONDS WELL TO ANY CONCERNS I RAISE (10% Don't Know)
