



Year 4 Curriculum Newsletter: Spring 2

Below are the key learning links for each subject that will be covered in Year 4 this half term.



English

Novel as a Theme

- Explore, identify and use Standard English verb inflections for writing e.g.

We were instead of we was; I was instead of I were; I did instead of I do ne. -


- Improvise and compose dialogue, demonstrating their understanding of Standard and non-Standard English.

- Create sentences with fronted adverbials for 'when' and 'where'

- Discuss and record ideas for planning e.g. *story board, boxing-up text types to create a plan.*

- Develop settings and characterisation using vocabulary to create atmosphere.

- Plan and write an opening paragraph which combines the introduction of a setting and character/s.



Non-Chronological Reports

- Identify, select and use determiners e.g. *a, the, this, that, these, those, some, many, every.*

- Explore, identify and use Standard English verb inflections for writing e.g. *We were instead of we was; I was instead of I were; I did instead of I done.* - Identify and discuss the purpose, audience, structure, vocabulary and grammar of non-fiction. - Discuss and record ideas for planning e.g. *boxingup text types to create a plan.*



- Use paragraphs to organise writing in non-fiction texts.

- Use organisational devices in non-fiction writing, e.g. captions, text boxes, diagram, lists.

Maths


FRACTIONS

- Understand and use improper fractions
- Convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers.
- Find equivalent fractions
- Add and subtract fractions (including mixed numbers)



DECIMALS

- Understand the equivalence between tenths as a fraction and a decimal.
- Place tenths on a place value grid and on a number line.
- Understand the equivalence between hundredths as a fraction and a decimal.
- Place hundredths on a place value grid and on a number line.
- Divide 1 and 2 digit numbers by 10 and 100.



• This represents 4 hundredths = $\frac{4}{100}$

Physical Education

Invasion Games - Movement

This lesson gives children the opportunity to attempt to achieve all learning goals for the unit: to play competitively, to develop teamwork, attacking & defending, to consolidate dribbling and develop the skills to finding space.

Swimming

This lesson gives children the opportunity to develop both their arm and leg actions when attempting back crawl, think about their breathing as well as begin to evaluate their own and other's technique.

Good Vibrations - I can describe and explain sound sources


Hearing Sounds - I can explain how different sounds travel.

Soundproofing - I can investigate ways to absorb sound.

Making Music - I can make a musical instrument to play different sounds.


