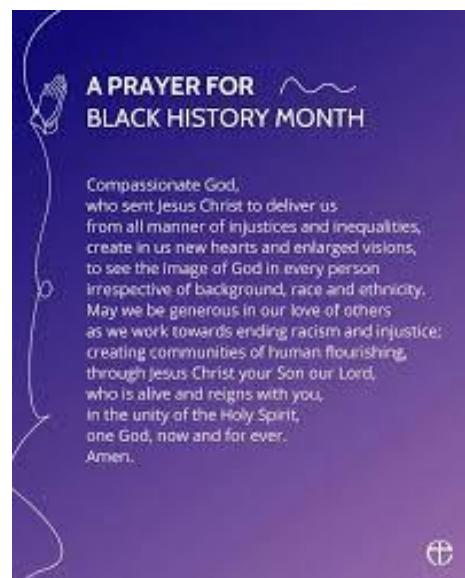
Next week we look forward to showing racism the red card on Friday as we wear red to champion this wonderful aim!
